

CAUTIONARY NOTE:

Chicken Pox

It is a matter of great concern that several students of the primary and pre-primary classes have been found to be infected with **chicken pox**.

Caused by the varicella-zoster virus (VZV), chickenpox is very contagious. Kids who do get it might have an itchy rash of blister like spots all over the body and flu-like symptoms. An infected child should stay home and rest until the rash is gone.

Chicken Pox is spread by droplets from a sneeze or cough, or by contact with the clothing, bed linens or oozing blisters of an infected person. The onset of symptoms is 10 to 21 days after exposure. The disease is most contagious a day or two before the **rash** appears and until the **rash** is completely dry and scabbed over.

Parents, if they come across above mentioned symptoms in their kids, must urgently seek expert medical advice, and ensure that the infected child gets proper rest at home and comes to school only when recuperated and medically declared not contagious.
